Synopsis

Be With Me (12A)

Directed by legendary Singapore filmmaker Erik Khoo this beautiful and delicately crafted drama is a rich tapestry of three stories woven around the themes of love, hope and destiny. With two fictional stories, one following teenage lesbian lovers and the other the tale of a plump security guard who is infatuated with a career woman. The third story focuses on the real-life Theresa Chan a 61-year-old woman who has been deaf since the age of 12 and blind since 14 and whose life story inspired the film. As the characters lead their separate lives they are bound by one common desire - to be with their loved one, a desire that can lead to both pain and pleasure.
